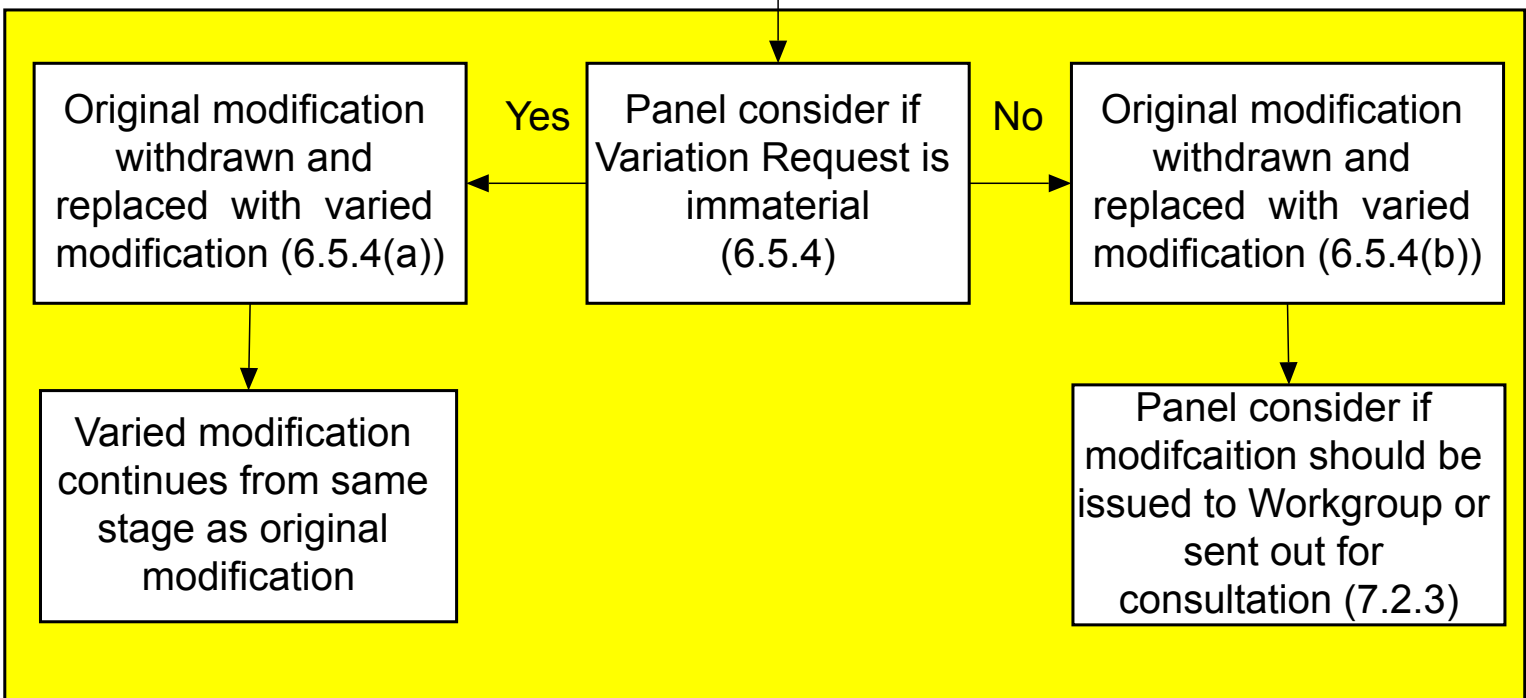

Modification Rules	Comments on Process
<p>2.1 Definitions</p> <p>"Self-Governance Modification Proposal": a Modification Proposal or an alternative to such proposal which:</p> <p>(a) the Modification Panel has determined satisfies the Self-Governance Criteria under paragraph 7.2.3(a)(i) (including after any variation of such proposal under paragraph 6.5) and in respect of which the Code Administrator on behalf of the Modification Panel has submitted to the Authority a Self-Governance Statement (which has not been withdrawn by the Code Administrator on behalf of the Modification Panel or rejected by the Authority by the Self-Governance Modification Proposal Determination Date); or</p>	<p>This indicates that should a modification be varied under paragraph 6.5, its Self Governance status should be reconfirmed by Panel.</p>
<p>6.5 Withdrawal or variation of Modification Proposals</p>	<p>This section specifically deals with the process for variations. Withdrawal of a modification has not been considered in the comments below.</p>
<p>6.5.1 A Proposer may:</p> <p>(b) subject to paragraph 6.5.7, vary a Modification Proposal, at any time before the Modification Panel has determined to proceed to Consultation pursuant to paragraph 7.2.3(b)(i), by notice to the Secretary, and subject to paragraph 6.4, and to paragraph 12.4, any Modification Proposal so varied shall replace the original Proposal;</p>	<p>BEFORE Panel determination to Consultation</p> <p>(b) advises that a modification can be varied by the Proposer at any time before it is issued to Consultation – the JO uses the term amended modification and this is used to title the email notification. It does not attract the suffix 'V' at this point as it is considered to be a revised version and the version number is incremented accordingly.</p> <p>Note: See 2.1 Self Governance definition, above: This indicates that the Self Governance status of a modification should be reconfirmed following a variation (amendment) to the modification.</p>

<p>(c) subject to paragraphs 6.4, 6.5.7 and 12.4, request a variation to a Modification Proposal ("variation request"), at any time after the Modification Panel has determined to proceed to Consultation pursuant to paragraph 7.2.3(b)(i) and before the Modification Panel has made a determination in respect of such Modification Proposal pursuant to paragraph 9.3.3(a), by notice to the Secretary, and any such variation request shall contain a description of the nature of the variation</p>	<p>AFTER Panel determination to Consultation but BEFORE determination on Implementation</p> <p>(c) advises that once has determined that a modification should be issued to Consultation, it can only be varied by the Proposer by submission of a formal Variation Request to the JO for consideration by Panel.</p> <p>In addition, the Variation Request must be made BEFORE Panel has made its determination on implementation. The JO publishes a template for Variation Requests, which helps to guide the Proposer to provide the information required by Panel.</p>
<p>6.5.2 The Secretary shall, within a reasonable period of time following any withdrawal, variation or variation request (except where such variation request is made at the Modification Panel meeting) notify each Transporter, each Member, each User, each Third Party Participant and each Non-Code Party of such withdrawal, variation or variation request (as the case may be).</p>	<p>The JO advises the industry of all amended modifications or Variation Requests with the exception of those raised directly at Panel. The latter would be recorded in the Panel minutes.</p>
<p>6.5.3 Following receipt of the notice given pursuant to paragraph 6.5.1(c) the Secretary shall submit such variation request to the appropriate Modification Panel which the Proposer may attend for the purpose of explaining the variation request.</p>	<p>Variation Requests are included on the Panel agenda.</p> <p>However, variations (amended modifications) are not, which may cause a conflict with the requirements of the Self Governance definition at 2.1 above.</p>

<p>6.5.4 Subject to paragraph 6.4, and paragraph 12.4, the Modification Proposal shall be varied to replace the original Proposal which shall be deemed withdrawn where the Modification Panel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) determines by a unanimous vote that the variation request is immaterial, and in such case the varied Modification Proposal shall continue through the Modification Procedures from the point at which the original Proposal was deemed withdrawn; (b) does not so determine in accordance with (a), and in such case the Modification Panel shall make a determination in respect of the varied Modification Proposal in accordance with paragraph 7.2.3. 	<p>It is not clear in the text that this paragraph only applies to Variation Requests 6.5.1 (c).</p> <p>For Variation Requests, Panel test the materiality of the variation and a unanimous vote is required for it to be considered immaterial, otherwise the Variation Request is considered material.</p> <p>Use of Plain English - this question should be posed: “Is the Variation Request material?” – positive votes are then recorded in the Panel minutes indicating the Variation Request is not immaterial.</p> <p>For immaterial – the original modification is considered withdrawn and the varied modification (attracting the suffix ‘V’) continues in the process from where the original modification had reached.</p> <p>For material – the original modification is withdrawn and the varied modification is treated as a new modification and is tested against the SCR, Self Governance criteria and whether the modification should be sent to Workgroup for assessment or issued to consultation. See 7.2.3 below.</p>
<p>6.5.5 The Proposer of a variation request may withdraw it at any time before the Modification Panel votes in accordance with paragraph 6.5.4.</p>	<p>The Proposer can withdraw a Variation Request prior to its consideration by Panel.</p>
<p>6.5.7 For the purposes of this paragraph 6.5:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the Authority, upon request by a Proposer of a Significant Code Review Modification Proposal, may direct: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) that the Proposer may vary, withdraw or make a variation request in respect of the relevant Significant Code Review Modification Proposal in accordance with paragraph 6.5; or (ii) that the Proposer may not vary, withdraw or make a variation request in respect of the relevant Significant Code 	<p>Where the modification has been raised to satisfy the requirements of a Significant Code Review, it can only be varied or a variation request raised with the approval of the Authority.</p> <p>It is expected that a letter is provided by the Authority or a statement is provided for the Panel minutes.</p>

The Variations process recently caused a conflict following the send back of an FMR that contained an alternative modification. Both modifications required Variation Requests following disapplication of the rules and Panel determined that both variations were material.

Both modifications were then tested against paragraph 7.2.3 and Panel the determined under (b) (i) to issue them both the Consultation. As both modifications had been issued to Consultation, neither could be considered as an alternative 6.4.5 (see below) prevents alternatives being raised at this stage.

This should be considered an exceptional scenario and that modifications which determined to be alternates and subsequently Varied under 6.4.5 should remain as alternatives in the process.
